Our Musicians! Widdershins:

Annie Grieshop: Annie has been playing piano for dances for thirty-five years, starting with the Onion Creek Cloggers band. She played for our first few balls, starting in 1992, with Susan Brown and Roger Alexander, as well as with Gary and Linda Lieberman. She has played for several Burns' Balls, various Scottish dance classes, and at the Central Iowa Traditional Dance and Music Festival. She was Accompanist and Piano Tech for the Marshalltown School District, and played in the pit for school and Community Theater productions. These days, she works for GitHub, but you can often find Annie at her daughter's farm, hanging out with her grandchildren (and their parents).

Gary Lieberman: Gary has been playing for dancing since 1979 when he moved to Central Iowa. He plays clarinet, flute, alto flute, soprano sax, alto sax, guitar, and several other instruments. He has played for dancing on at least three continents including Australia, England, and many places around the US including fifteen years with Bob McQuillen at Augusta Dance Week. He also plays English Country dance music with Cecil's Harp, jazz with the Indigo Monks, and clarinet in the Ames Municipal Band. By day he is a retired mathematics professor (Iowa State, Emeritus) and a full-time grandpa!
